Bob is a product of the West Side of Buffalo. He started his schooling at Nativity B.V.M., then Bishop Fallon High School where he played basketball, football and baseball. Bob then continued his education at E.C.C. and received an A.A.S. degree in Recreation Supervision which then led him to graduating from U.B. with a B.S. degree in Physical Education.

His Boys Club employment started as a summer day camp aide at Beaver Island State Park. After 3 summers working at camp, he accepted the Phys. Ed. Director position at the Virginia St. Boys Club. Two years later he was promoted to the Club Director position at the now John F. Beecher Club.

Bob left Buffalo to accept a Club Director position with the Trenton Boys & Girls in New Jersey. After a year he came back to his home town to accept a position as Club Director of the Bailey-Doat clubhouse. He was there until he resigned from the Buffalo Clubs in 1997. In 2001 he returned to the clubs to accept a position as Director of Operations for the 7 unit Northtowns Boys and Girls Club. Bob holds the distinction as the only Club Professional to work full time at all 5 Buffalo Clubs. During that time he also worked at St. Andrews Country Day School as the Phys. Ed. teacher coaching numerous boys and girls athletic teams. At one time Bob worked for St. Andrews and the Boys & Girls Clubs simultaneously for 18 years. His work day started at 7:30 a.m. until 9:30 p.m. Mon. - Fri.

Along with his full time jobs Bob was a proud member of the Butler Mitchell Alumni Association where he held various leadership positions as a Board Member, Secretary and a member of the Finance Committee. He also found time to be a Merit Badge Counselor for his son Robs' Boy Scouts troop in Kenmore. Bob has also donated over 12 gallons of blood to the American Red Cross.

Bob feels his strong faith in God, family and his many great mentors over the years, helped him grow in the Human Service field. One of those mentors was the Athletic Director of Fallon Carmen Battaglia. Bob first heard of Carmen before attending Fallon because Mr. B. also work for the Boys Clubs for many years. Staff at the clubs told Bob great stories of Carmen's work with disadvantaged kids. At first he was in awe of Mr. B's reputation as we all were. Carmen inspired Bob to be a teacher because of his positive impact on the students at Fallon. Little did Bob know that he would follow a similar work history of teaching and working at the Boys Club as Carmen did. Bob, just recently, was honored to find out that he will be inducted into the Butler Mitchell Boys & Girls Club Alumni Association Hall of Fame in November of 2019.
