BIOGRAPHY OF PETER STARKS - Bishop Fallon H.S. Graduate 1964

On our Atlanta flight from Europe, I asked husband Peter what motivated him to complete over 50 international projects for the United Nations, The World Bank, and major hotel and tourism companies. Without hesitation he said, "growing up in the city of good neighbors". Good thing we had a long flight ahead... because I needed a much fuller explanation.

As his wife of 33 years, I may be in the best position to share how Peter carried out Buffalo ethics through his work in 45 countries and why you might consider him as a Distinguished Alumni.

Of course, I knew his work. But I wanted to know more about his motivations. Here is a summary of what he told me over drinks at 35,000 feet.

North Buffalo

As a young boy in a lower middle-class family Peter thought the only difference between the Irish, Poles, Italians, Germans, Afro-Americans, and others in his neighborhood is that they ate different food. That's it! Otherwise, in school, on the sport field, and on the street, everybody was just a kid, and every parent was your parent. Neighbors were neighbors. It was what we later learned to call "extended family". It felt good. It felt safe. We slept well.

Bishop Fallon

High School brought together the hormones and competitive spirit of young men from north, south, east, and west Buffalo. And, while there were plenty of tense moments in lockers rooms, at dances, and on the playing fields, Christian ethics and early learned Buffalo values ruled the day. He left Fallon with some of the most enduring friendships one could hope for. Buffalo guys were special. They understood diversity. They realized we were all in the same game of life together. This resonated with Peter who, at this stage, had a growing sense that he was headed for a

humanitarian-based career that would be all about moving minds from division to inclusion and respect for all. The 70's "Age of Aquarius" added octane, and his February birth sign as a water-carrying Aquarian humanitarian... sealed it.

Buffalo Restaurants for Buffalo Neighbors

Steeped into Buffalo's neighborly ethics, he wanted to do more than study four more years. Instead, he wanted to help build a Buffalo business that brought people together in cooperation and good humor: something that was more public service than it was "business". He convinced the Turgeon Brothers restaurateurs that Buffalo could use some new, well-run restaurants that did more than make profit. They should bring all Buffalonians together, enjoying quality, comfort, and of course, equality. While the owners may have been more about business than Peter, they none-the-less thought his idealism and motivation couldn't hurt. Over the course of four years, Peter led the successful development and operations of hallmark restaurants including "Sign of the Steer", "Crouching Lion", "Riverside Inn", and the "Packet Inn". Tens of thousands of Buffalonians would remember these venues for their marriage proposals, weddings, anniversaries, graduations, holidays, and every other reason to go out for fellowship and a meal. The satisfaction of seeing Buffalonians enjoying each other more than made up for the seven-day work weeks.

College Time

At the same time fellow Fallon classmates were graduating from college, the Turgeon Brothers where pressing Peter to reinforce his humanitarian commitments with business savvy, and they backed it up with personal recommendations to the famous Cornell University School of Hotel Administration in Ithaca. He went. He graduated with honors and he was immediately hired after a campus meeting with Bill Marriott, Jr..

Hotels for Humanity: Europe, Middle East, and Africa

Mr. Marriott wanted to expand into global markets. Peter wanted to help develop jobs that engendered staff hospitality to each other and customers. He wanted to promote equality and diversity in the hospitality workforce by bringing together a workforce that would not have known each other any other way. From his base in London, he traveled to develop, open, and operate hotels in Europe, the Middle East, and Africa in countries as diverse as Egypt and Austria. Through it all he combined the quality and ethics of Marriott with Buffalo's "good neighbors" DNA; and in the process, impacted tens of thousands of international staff.

United Nations and The World Bank

Peter came to realize that he could have a broader impact by implementing regional and country wide economic tourism development projects managed by the United Nations and those funded by the World Bank. From his new office in Geneva, Switzerland he traveled to implement projects in developing regions throughout Asia. He imbued every project with the Buffalo' "good neighbor's" spirit by creating common purpose and ethics among diverse groups.

Sustainable Project Leadership

With hotel, tourism, and community projects successfully launched, Peter turned his focus to developing the future leaders needed to sustain these projects and maintain the ethos of inclusivity among "good neighbors". Sensing a gap in industry and higher education he financed, developed, and marketed unique online business simulations which were quickly adopted by major hotel companies, tourism agencies, and over 200 universities. Along the way, a number of colleges invited him as a visiting faculty member, and he currently serves on the Advisory Committee of three major universities.

As our plane approached Atlanta, I asked Peter the 'What's next?" Question. "Come clean" I said. What's your next move and where will it take us? After a slow sip, he reminded me that we met in Buffalo. We are committed to Buffalo ethics. Buffalo is redeveloping itself. Buffalo may welcome another contributor. Buffalo has good neighbors......Sooo....
